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Once the complete manuscript has been submitted to us for publication, it will undergo a preliminary check by a member of our editorial team, who will liaise with your book editor. If there are any queries on your work, your book editor will contact you.

We want to publish your work promptly, so we have outlined some of the most common obstacles that we encounter that can cause delays to the publication process.

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Before including a figure in your chapter, take a moment to check its quality. Does it look grainy or blurry? If it features text, is the text large enough to read clearly? Can you understand any colour coding when it is printed in black and white?

Bear in mind that the figure will likely be smaller in print than it appears on your computer screen, so very fine details may not be clear to the reader.

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- Your affiliation or brief biography, to include in the front matter of the book
- An abstract of up to 150 words and a list of up to 6 keywords
- Your ORCID numbers (only if you use them!)

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Maths

There are a number of different ways to introduce maths into your chapter file, but some ways are much better than others. Please embed any maths directly into your chapter, using MathType or a Word Equation software.

Working with 'plain text' softwares, such as LaTeX, can cause problems for our production department and lead to delays in the publishing process, so please avoid using these.

Remember to distinguish carefully between superior and subscript characters and use italic type for any characters to be set in italic. Equations should also be numbered consecutively within chapters.
